## ChangAi celebrates its first year of operations

The 14th of March 2009 marked the anniversary of the signing of ChangAi's project agreement with its provincial level partner, the Yunnan Women's and Children's Development Centre (YWCDC) and the completion of Year 1 of project operations in ChangAi's four project villages.

- 46 villagers from village 2\* attended the 2<sup>nd</sup> round of sugarcane training. Topics included how to increase per unit yield, growing techniques and selection of sugarcane varieties.
- 47 villagers from Village 1\* attended the 2<sup>nd</sup> round of **pig-raining training**. Topic included building a sty and common methods of disease prevention.
- In-home consultations by local veterinaries and representatives from the Sugarcane Centre were made to 12 loan recipients from Village 1\* and 11 from Village 2\*

### March & April 2009

- A needs assessment for year 2 was carried out to determine the next recipients of ChangAi's education grants and micro-credit loans.
- Year 2 micro-credit loans extended to 23 new families.

# **Ongoing support from ChangAi:**

- Education grants assist primary, lower-middle school and University-age children attend and board at school.
- A health fund provides for medical expenses for sick villagers and their families
- Micro-credit loans assist villagers engage in pig-raising or crop-growing.

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## **Project Overview**

Founded in 2007, the ChangAi Children's Project operates in four villages in south-western Yunnan province which are deeply affected by disease, drug use and poverty. The Project works holistically on four levels to:

- Directly support vulnerable children.
- Enhance children's household environment.
- Improve the local community's situation as conducive to child development.
- Develop a model relevant for supporting children in poor villages across China.

From the Project's commencement in March 2008, ChangAi has a five year plan in which to work with local communities to enhance health and education opportunities for children.

Project village 3\* opens Child Activity Room



In February 2009, the Changai-sponsored child Activity Room was completed in Village 3\* - The first official activity, an art workshop, was held in the Activity room in April during a visit by ChangAi Beijing staff.

Project partners and ChangAi staff work with children to bead sarongs and decorate hats and T-shirts. The two large bookcases in the picture are filling with toys and books sourced through a combination of purchases by the local Women's Federation and donations from ChangAi supporters.
